Page Mountain Extender: Traverse

RATING/DIFFICULTY:

- » PD, 5.4, 1000 m climbing distance.

FIRST ASCENT:

- » Micha Rinn (Germany) and Simon Richardson (Scotland), 30th July 2017.

LOCATION:

- » Page Mountain Extender (2625 m) is located between Monarch Mountain, Princess Mountain and Turtle Mountain. It is part of the Page Mountain Ridge, which is about 8 km long. The entire Page Mountain Ridge separates Page Glacier and Empire-Way Glacier, a branch of the Monarch Icefield. GPS-Coordinates of the summit: N 51° 54' 37.6", W 125° 55' 42.5".

ROUTE DESCRIPTION:

- » The route starts at the North Col, located between Sugar Loaf and Page Mountain Extender. It follows the beautiful and outstanding sharp white ridge, which is covered in ice, to the summit of Page Mountain Extender. GPS-Coordinates of the beginning of the climb: N 51° 54' 52.9", W 125° 55' 53.8".

DESCENT:

- » Going down by following the South Ridge to the South Col. Rather than descending the ice field, downclimb left on partly brittle rock back down to the Empire-Way Glacier.
