# Mont Vert de Greuvetta Group: P2936 South Face Route

## RATING/DIFFICULTY:

- » AD 4b, Trad, 350 m climbing distance, 290 m vertical elevation.

## LOCATION/ACCESS:

- » An enjoyable mountaineering route ascending the south face of P2936m. Descent down the route with one abseil from the summit tower and two down the initial ramp.

## EQUIPMENT/GEAR:

- » C4-Camalots 0.3–3.0, 1 set of Stoppers, slings, 50m double ropes.

## ROUTE DESCRIPTION IN THREE SECTIONS:

1. section, 100m: Start 50m right of the top of the moraine crest east of the lower Greuvetta Glacier @ 2650m (45,880288°N, 7,034647°E). Follow a right-to-left rock ramp leading behind a tower.
2. second section, 170m: Climb a broken rocky gully for 50m, before breaking right onto easy-angled rocky terrain that leads to a small col on the ridge.
3. section, 80m: Continue up the crest in two pitches towards the summit. The second pitch up a steep V-groove is the crux (4b). The peak has twin summits with a measured elevation of 2921m (45,881380°N, 7,032885°E).
